What will I do as an MRC Los Angeles Member?

During a large public health emergency or disaster, volunteers are needed to support Los Angeles County Department of Public Health in their response. Volunteers may be called to:

- ◆ Dispense medication
- ◆ Screen clients
- ◆ Distribute information
- ◆ Provide mental health consultation
- ◆ Perform data entry
- ◆ Support public health activities throughout the year

Assignments will be determined according to your skills and the needs of the response. You will not be asked to function in roles outside of your skill set.
